## Timothys & Travels

If you want to tour Uganda, come visit the Timothys with me! The Timothys are now scattered about: one in the far east, one in the south, and the rest in the north. Over the last few weeks I have had the opportunity to meet with each of them and begin the discipleship process. All profess interest in experiencing brief medical mission trips to work among the IDPs. One of the Timothys, Dr. Zac, will join me for work at Nyapea Hospital for two weeks in November. This visit is to provide health care but also about gathering a team of healthcare workers for a short medical mission (first weekend in December) to Gulu district for work among the IDPs. This will be the maiden run of the medical mission trips, so prayers are needed. Please pray for logistics, gathering and forming the team, and the opportunity to see God at work in the lives of those to whom we provide care and the lives of the team members.

Our travel has not been limited to visiting Timothys. Visits to two of the three medical schools in Uganda have been on the itinerary as well. Mbarara University of Science and Technology is in the southern part of Uganda (eleven hours of driving). Gulu University is in the north (four hours of driving). I really just wanted to find out about Christian gatherings for students at each school, but have ended up being invited to serve as a visiting lecturer in the departments of surgery. The time and travel commitment would be immense if I accept either of these invitations, so please pray with me as I listen to God about how to "order my days."
