## On the Home Front

The July rains have come in force here in northern Uganda. It has been a good time to be closer to home. Since leaving the USA in late June, the work has been concentrated in Nebbi District.

First, a visit at Nyapea Hospital to share the workload and encourage the healthcentre staff after a March storm blew off the roof of the main building. With your kind assistance, the roof and ceiling replacement are nearing completion. Many operations were performed, patients cared for, and fun fellowship occurred



with friends there.

Next, a bit of time was spent at home in Goli to do a bit of stock-taking: inventory, taxes, study and reflection were included. The study is following NT Wright's discussion of the changes in understanding of 'covenant' from the Old Testament to the New Testament expounded in Paul's writings. Moses had to wear a veil to shield the Israelites from the reflected glory of the Lord in his face. As a result of Jesus' work on the cross, well, 2 Corinthians 3:16-18 says it best: "But, whenever anyone turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away. Now the Lord is Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. And we, who with unveiled faces all reflect the Lord's glory, are being transformed into His likeness with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit."

The mission fellowship in Goli has been well attended. We have looked at the lives of Abraham and Paul to see how God called them, what they were like before the call, how God used them in mission and how their understanding of God changed their lives and those they reached with God's word. We have also role-played sharing our faith on the job and

discussed the role of God in suffering. Robin and I are working on our discipleship plan for these Goli "Timothys" in this fellowship.

It has also been an important time for Robin



to be at home with his family, which now numbers four. Please join

me in welcoming Damaris (see Acts 17:34 for the name reference), whose birthday is June 16. She is very cute. Her brother, Robert Jones, was very confused about her origin, asking who is her father and who is her mother.

We have taken this time in our home district

to visit the Adusi Health-centre to follow up on our mission there in March. The money the team raised was used to construct the new (and only) examination table for the centre. Now we just need to find a mattress....

We are about to embark on a long journey to various areas in southern Sudan. We are eager to see what God is doing and how we might be used by God in the midst of the suffering. Stay tuned to this channel for further updates!

The visit in America was so short. I feel that I did not have time to talk to everyone thoroughly. And alas, the internet has been down for over one month, so I cannot even try to communicate in that format. I want to thank you for your loving support.
