What happens when you travel around in Southern Sudan is very similar to what happens when you read the book of Isaiah...you get a tiny glimpse into the incredible majesty of God. This God of creation, the Lord of the universe has not left us but continues to interact with us. The Southern Sudanese people could have easily been wiped out during the civil war. However, God not

only preserved a remnant but called them into a saving relationship with Him. So, the church has been born and is growing in Southern Sudan. Just as God interacted with Israelites in their choices *and* the consequences of their choices, He is interacting today with the Southern Sudanese. He was and is attentive to every detail in history.

My response to these glimpses of God is to do as the prophet Isaiah directs: "Give thanks to the Lord, call on His name, make known among the nations what He has done." (Isaiah 12:11). I have a great job: watching God at work in a nation and in individual lives as they respond to God's call. I also get to engage in taking care of patients and operating, my favorite pastimes. So I am very grateful to God for my life and my work. I also get to share my life and work with an amazing group of friends and supporters. So I am very grateful to God for you, your friendship and your participation in this gospel work.

Talking to God is a privilege that we have every moment of every day. I like to keep the phone line open in an ongoing conversation. I tell God what is on my
