## Showing God's Character in Sudan

If the name of this mission is Uganda/Sudan Medical Mission, where is the Sudan part??? That was the essence of my question to the Lord in the fall as I was praying through my calendar of activities. I had made contact with the Episcopal Church of Sudan representatives in Kampala, Uganda in August. I knew one of my professors in seminary was thinking of bringing a team to work among the Sudanese refugees in northern Kenya. It seemed important to begin making contacts on the ground in southern Sudan to initiate the process of bringing medical mission teams into Sudan. How do I start? When will something happen to make it possible for me to proceed? Do I need to spend months and years working only in Uganda to prepare for moving the mission work into Sudan? I had many questions for the Lord.

The Lord has provided many answers. I will be spending the month of January working among the Sudanese in two locations: Aweil and Kakuma. In a few days a

team of Sudanese will arrive in Kampala. Comprised mainly of Lost Boys, this team will travel to a town called Aweil in the northwest corner of southern Sudan. For many this is the first time they will return to the area they regard as home. Significantly, there is a IDP (Internally Displaced People) camp of Darfurians nearby. Reuniting with relatives and friends will be combined with reconciliation work with the Darfurians. Kakuma Refugee Camp is located in the northwest corner of Kenya and is home to refugees from several countries. A team from Trinity School for Ministry will travel there to provide teaching and pastoral care to Sudanese from January 14-26. God has provided abundantly (as usual; c.f. Ephesians 3:20).

I would treasure your prayers during this time for: travel mercies, divine appointments, health, etc. In addition would you join me in praying that these teams would see what the Lord is doing and boldly follow Him (c.f. John 5:19)? God bless you and Happy New Year!
